



Family Conduct & Coordination Policy.

Program Year 2026–2027

Pack 62 is a place for adventure. Every adult helps make it that way for every Scout, every family.

This policy sets the ground rules. Every family signs annually through the Pack 62 Annual Family Survey. A blank acknowledgment block is included at the end for families who prefer to sign in print.

SECTION 1

Conduct at Pack Events

At any Pack event — meetings, campouts, day trips, ceremonies, fundraisers, anywhere we gather as Pack 62 — adults agree to:

- Treat every other adult with civility, even when we disagree.
- Keep adult-only disputes (legal, financial, family, personal) out of earshot of Scouts and out of Scout-accessible spaces.
- Not involve Scouts, other parents, or Pack leadership in inter-parent or inter-adult disputes.
- Step away or leave if asked by the Cubmaster, event chair, or Pack Chair. We will not embarrass anyone in front of the kids. We will not negotiate in the moment.

SECTION 2

Court Orders and Legal Documents

If you have a court order or other legal document affecting attendance at Pack events — a no-contact order, protection order, restraining order, parenting plan, or similar — please share documentation with Pack leadership.

Pack 62 acknowledges and respects court orders presented to us and treats the documentation confidentially. We do not interpret, enforce, or adjudicate any such order. Compliance with the order is the responsibility of the parties named in it, not the Pack.

If you have questions about how an order applies to a specific situation, please consult your attorney rather than the Pack.

SECTION 3

Alcohol, Drugs, and Tobacco

Consistent with the BSA Guide to Safe Scouting, the following are prohibited at all Pack events: **alcoholic beverages, controlled substances (including marijuana, regardless of state law), and tobacco products (including electronic vapor products)**. The Cubmaster, event chair, or Pack Chair may ask any adult violating this policy to leave the event, without affecting the Scout's participation.

SECTION 4

Transportation and Driver Requirements

Adults transporting Scouts to or from any Pack event shall:

- Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
- Hold a current, valid driver's license.
- Carry vehicle insurance meeting state minimum coverage requirements.
- Ensure every occupant uses a properly installed seat belt or, for youth under the applicable age, an appropriate child restraint.
- Comply with all applicable BSA Guide to Safe Scouting transportation requirements.

The Pack does not assign or assume responsibility for inter-family transportation arrangements; coordination remains between participating families.

SECTION 5

Photo and Image Use

Photographs, video, and other recorded images of Scouts may be used by the Pack in Pack-published materials (Pack website, Pack-maintained social media, recruitment materials, internal communications) only with the consent of the Scout's parent or guardian. Consent is collected annually through the Pack 62 Annual Family Survey using the Pack 62 Photo Release Form and may be withdrawn at any time by written notice to the Committee.

SECTION 6

Parent Observation

Per BSA Youth Protection, all aspects of the Cub Scouting program are open to observation by parents. Nothing in this policy changes that right. This policy governs adult behavior at events; it does not exclude parents from observing their Scout.

Youth Protection concerns: Contact the Council Scout Executive at Adventure West Council immediately. Suspected abuse is also reported to law enforcement per BSA policy and applicable law.

Other grievances: Bring the concern first to the Pack Chair (or to another Committee Member if the concern involves the Pack Chair). Unresolved matters may be escalated to the Charter Organization Representative, the District Executive, or the Council, consistent with the Pack 62 Operating Procedures and BSA grievance procedures.

No retaliation. The Pack will not retaliate against any Committee Member, volunteer, parent, or youth member for raising a good-faith concern.
